



## 2006 KILIKANOON PRODIGAL GRENACHE

**91 pts** “The dark ruby-colored 2006 Prodigal Grenache spent 18 months in seasoned French oak. The nose exhibits damp earth, cinnamon, sage, and black cherry leading to a sweet, layered, spicy, concentrated Grenache with a silky texture and enough soft tannin to develop for another two years.”
