



2006 LEEUWIN ESTATE ART SERIES RIESLING

WINEMAKER: Paul Atwood
REGION: Margaret River, Western Australia
VARIETALS: Riesling
FERMENTATION: Stainless Steel
ALCOHOL: 12% alc/vol.

VINTAGE NOTES:

A mild winter and gentle spring winds allowed for good flowering and berry set. The summer was generally dry, warm and clear with few hot days. Cool nights and warm days over the harvest period enabled the development of fabulous fruit varietal characters. Picking this variety at night and at dawn preserved the delicate fruit flavors. 2006 was a great year for Riesling at Leeuwin Estate and consequently, this is an outstanding example of this wine.

WINEMAKING:

The grapes were picked in the cool of the night by machine and immediately pressed. The juice was cold settled with enzymes for 7-10 days and then racked off gross lees. The juice was warmed and inoculated with pure yeast cultures and fermented in stainless steel tanks under controlled temperature conditions. After fermentation, the wine was fined, cold stabilized and bottled.

TASTING NOTES:

A wine of brilliant clarity, which has a very pale straw color with lime green tinges. The nose shows lifted aromas of citrus blossom, musk, green apple, lime and quince mixed with a delicious mineral edge, which are indicators of an excellent wine. A wine of exceptional length, the palate displays classic Rieslings flavors of lime, grapefruit and green apple. This is a wine with great intensity and depth of flavor. The palate finishes with clean, crisp succulent acidity.
