WINEMAKER: Chester Osborn

R E G | 0 N: McLaren Vale, South Australia

VARIETALS: Cabernet Sauvignon

MATURATION: 18 months in new & older French oak barriques

ALCOHOL: 14.5% alc/vol

THE ART OF BEING DIFFERENT:

The grapes for this wine come largely from a near extinct clone of Cabernet Sauvignon. This unnamed clone yields no more than one ton per acre because of its very poor setting ability and the tiny size of its berries. However, the quality of the grapes is far superior, with wonderful violet and blackcurrant aromas, great acidity and long, intense fine- grain tannins.

WINEMAKING:

Fruit is gently crushed in an open-mouthed, rubber-toothed, Demoisy crusher before being transferred to open vessels for fermentation. Here the cap is permanently submerged beneath the free run juice, avoiding any harsh plunging or pumping over. Traditional foot-treading takes place after fermentation is complete, then gentle basket pressing precedes transfer to barrel for 18 months maturation. After this time every barrel is individually assessed for quality, only the best barrels being selected for inclusion in The Coppermine Road.

TASTING NOTES:

A dense nose of cassis and mulberries with coffee and dark chocolate weaving through a backdrop of fine oak. More elegant than previous vintages, the palate offers freshness while still delivering concentration and complexity. Youthful flavors of cassis and red currant dance alongside violets, dried herbs and earth, with fine minerally tannins fanning out on the finish.
