



2008 PLANTAGENET OMRAH PINOT NOIR

Review Summary



90 pts “Plantagenet is in Western Australia’s Great Southern wine region, which seems at the end of the world...and it is! Pinot Noir grapes with intense flavors, grown on the Rocky Horror (don’t you love that name?) and Bouvray Vineyards give this wine depth and lots of character. There’s nothing funny, though, about this Pinot’s medium-deep ruby color, forward berry aromas with earthy back notes that mingle with traces of road tar. The aromatics lead nicely to sweet fruit, firm tannins and texture, ripe raspberry, refined tannins, 14% alcohol and a long supple finish. This is a good value Pinot.”
