WINEMAKING :

2008 vintage was a cooler season blessed with good rainfall on the Estate. This resulted in an above average harvest and fruit of excellent quality, with the Shiraz fruit displaying excellent colors and concentration. The fruit for this wine was hand-plunged in a combination of traditional open fermenters and stainless steel tank fermenters.

TASTING NOTES :

This shows the typical deep red color of Balgownie Shiraz, with vibrant berry fruit aromas and subtle use of oak. The palate shows rich blackberry, licorice and splashes of red fruit enlivened with hints of spice; fine tannins, long finish. The wine is medium-bodied, concentrated, yet elegant with a velvety texture and fine lingering tannins. While approachable in its youth, it can be cellared over the medium to long term.
