89 pts “Deep, bright red. Lively aromas of musky red fruits, dried flowers, smoke and Asian spices. Sweet, pliant raspberry and cherry flavors are enlivened by pungent minerality and complicated by smoke and anise. Silky tannins arrive late, allowing the wine's fruit to expand on the back end. Not powerful but very pinot, displaying very good balance and finishing cling.”

86 pts “Medium-deep ruby colored, the 2009 Pinot Noir has intense notes of warm black raspberries and black cherries with underlying tree bark, moss and stewed tea aromas. Medium-full bodied with a low to medium level of chewy tannins, the palate lends straightforward berry fruit flavors and crisp acid, finishing medium-long.”
