









2009 CULLEN EPHRAIM CLARKE SAUVIGNON BLANC SEMILLON

WINEMAKER: Vanya Cullen

R E G I O N: Margaret River, Western Australia

VARIETALS: Sauvignon Blanc (70%), Semillon (30%)

MATURATION: 27% of the wine matured 4 months in French barriques

ALCOHOL: 11.5% alc./vol

QUALITY, INTEGRITY, SUSTAINABILITY:

Diana Cullen will always be remembered as one of the Australian wine industry's most remarkable and adored women. She was responsible for making the Cullen wines from 1981 until 1989 when she handed the reigns to her highly talented daughter, Vanya, Australia's Winemaker of the Year in 2000. The Cullen vineyard is organically farmed and dry-grown with an 'A' grade certification with the Biological Farmers Association.

VINTAGE NOTES:

The quality of this wine is evidence that 2009 was a great vintage for Sauvignon Blanc and Semillon in Margaret River. It has now become clear that the use of biodynamic practices by the Cullens is encouraging the vines in each of their vineyards to express their own individuality and fruit characteristics.

TASTING NOTES:


On the nose, the 2009 Ephraim Clarke Fresh, lively and strong gooseberry and lime aromas are complemented by clean vanilla oak notes. The palate contains a multitude of fruit flavours, which include citrus, bay leaf, gooseberry and nectarine. This wine is drinking wonderfully now, and will continue to develop further complexity for a number of years under proper cellaring conditions.
