94 pts “The grapes are grown on two 60-year-old vineyards in the Watervale district, open-fermented and matured in used barrels. The color is excellent, full and bright, the fruits luscious and expressive, but with no jammy or confection notes. Controlled alcohol is a key to the wine that will repay cellaring if you wish, but is delicious now.”

Fleshy and broad on the palate, offering sweet dark berry and floral pastille flavors and a touch of tangy acidity.
