

## 2015 d'ARENBERG THE STUMP JUMP LIGHTLY WOODED CHARDONNAY

**WINEMAKER :** Chester Osborn  
**REGION :** McLaren Vale and Fleurieu Peninsula - South Australia  
**VARIETALS :** Chardonnay  
**MATURATION :** 60% matured in older French and American oak  
**ANALYSIS :** 12.8% alc/vol | 7.9 g/L TA | 3.17 pH

### BACKGROUND :

The name 'Stump Jump' relates to the significant South Australian invention – the Stump Jump plough. This plough became a popular piece of machinery for ploughing fields because of its ability to ride over stumps and gnarled "mallee" Eucalypt roots and snags, saving valuable time and resources by not stopping the draught horse.

### WINEMAKING :

Parcels of fruit are selected from vineyards in the McLaren Vale and the Fleurieu Peninsula. Once they have been gently crushed, the grapes are basket pressed to softly extract the juice from the skins. 60% of the juice is partially or fully fermented in a mixture of older French and American oak to add a touch of spice and mouthfeel. Once fermentation is complete all batches are tasted to determine which will suit this gentle and fruity style of Chardonnay.

### TASTING NOTES :

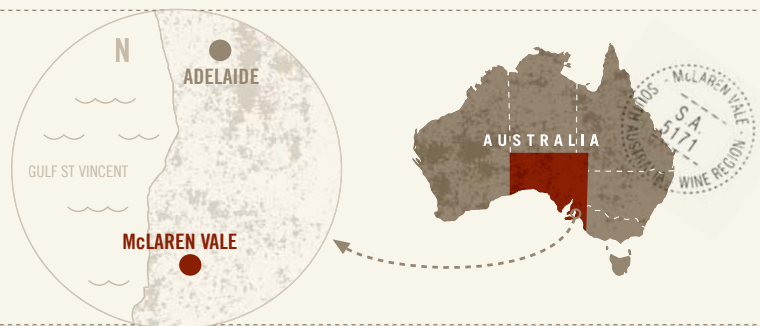
Fresh crunchy Chardonnay, full of Granny Smith apple, a squeeze of citrus and a slight brininess that becomes more evident on the palate. Prudent use of well-seasoned French oak adds discreet hazelnut and brioche notes to the mix. The mid palate continues to develop a slight creaminess but the finish remains tight, savory and long.
