



2005 YERINGBERG CABERNETS

Review Summary



92 pts “Inky ruby. Red- and blackcurrant aromas are complicated by tobacco, cedar, truffle and dried flowers; smells like a Bordeaux, and not a modern one. Sweet red and dark berry flavors are firmed by dusty tannins, gaining sweetness with air and taking a turn to plum and cherry preserves. Really coats the palate, finishing with powerful blueberry, graphite and sweet chewing tobacco qualities. Already complex, but possesses the balance to repay cellaring. (Old Bridge Cellars, Napa, CA)”

92 pts “The 2005 Yeringberg Red is a blend of 58% Cabernet Sauvignon, 19% Cabernet Franc, 14% Merlot, 6% Malbec, and 3% Petit Verdot. Purple-colored, the nose exhibits aromas of smoke, violets, cassis, clove, cinnamon, and black cherry. Elegantly rendered and sweet on the palate, it has a bit of tannin to resolve which will occur with another 2-3 years of bottle aging. Drink this stylish effort from 2011 to 2021.”
