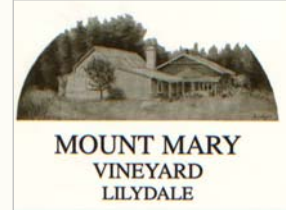




2006 MOUNT MARY PINOT NOIR

96 pts - Best of the Best by Variety “Clear color, yet to lose primary hue; a beautifully constructed pinot, lithe and silky on the mid-palate, then stretching out on the long finish, the sweet red fruits of the mid-palate reappearing on the aftertaste.”

93 pts “The 2006 Pinot Noir spent 22 months in barrel, 15% new. With a pale to medium ruby color, it gives fragrant aromas of violets, game, red cherry and wild strawberry with an earthy whiff of forest floor and truffles. Medium-high acid and a low to medium level of fine tannins lend just enough structure to the intense palate. Long in the finish, this wine is starting to drink now and should continue to be delicious until 2015+.”

Medium-bodied and silky-textured, it reveals elegant, sweet fruit, some structure, and a lengthy finish. It is reminiscent of a high-class Cotes de Nuits. Give it 2-3 years of additional cellaring and drink it from 2012 to 2021.”
