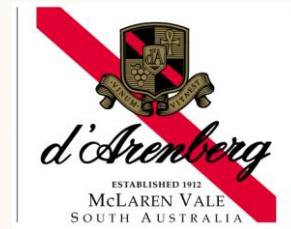


2007 d'ARENBERG THE FERAL FOX Review Summary

90 pts “Vivid red color. Fragrant aromas of fresh raspberry and cherry, complicated by fresh rose and violet. Juicy red berry flavors coat the palate, gaining richness with air and taking a turn to blackberry. Quite easy to drink, showing no rough edges and very good finishing clarity. “

90 pts “The medium ruby-colored 2007 The Feral Fox Pinot Noir is sourced from the cool climate Adelaide Hills. The grapes were crushed by foot and remained on their lees in barrel until bottling without fining or filtration. It reveals an attractive bouquet of smoke, cherry and raspberry leading to a silky-textured wine with a trace of underlying tannin. It should evolve for 2-3 years and drink well through 2017. “
