93 pts “Bright color; elegantly framed red fruit and black olive bouquet, showing some rolled leaf complexity; the palate is driven by fine acidity, fragrant red fruits and super fine-grained tannins; unevolved, but with a healthy and elegant future.”

92 pts “Saturated ruby. Captivating, high-pitched aromas of raspberry, cassis, star anise and fresh rose. Dense, sweet and intense, with solid grip and underlying structure to the sweet red berry and oak spice flavors; an intriguing floral element arrives as the wine opens in the glass. Fleshy and deep but light on its feet. This densely packed wine really stains the palate, finishing long and sweet, with harmonious tannins and a lingering perfume of candied flowers.”

92 pts “With a medium to deep garnet/purple color, it reveals pretty aromas of cassis, eucalyptus, chocolate mints, pencil shavings and cloves. It is well structured with medium to firm very fine tannins and medium-high acidity. With a full body, it has a generous amount of fruit lingering into the long finish. Consider drinking this wine from 2013 and it should continue to evolve and give pleasure to 2022+.”
