Review Summary

91+ pts “The Cornella Grenache is sourced from a four hectare vineyard planted in 1998 with yields of around three tons per acre. It displays a dark ruby red color and spicy framboise, plum and dark cherry scents. It is soft and lush on the palate and shows more spicy red fruit with earth notes. A delicious wine with moderate complexity, soft tannins and a persistent finish.”

91+pts “Glass-staining ruby. Bright, highly perfumed nose offers raspberry, strawberry and cherry liqueur aromas accented by an exotic apricot nuance and Asian spices. Lively and brisk, with very good focus and cut to its sweet red fruit and floral pastille flavors. Delicious but youthful, with expansive, sweet raspberry and cherry flavors clinging on the persistent finish. This gained weight and flesh with air and really deserves some patience.”
