THE UPS AND DOWNS OF DOWN UNDER

lash back to 30 years ago and imagine yourself browsing through your local retailers' wine racks. Think there is a section labeled Australia? Probably not.

Just five years later, in about 1989—when I spent some time working in a Manhattan wine shop—Australian wines were muscling their way onto the shelves. Back then, the \$7 Chardonnays and \$9 Shirazes offered terrific value, easily outdistancing California's "fighting varietals."

There wasn't much interest in the wines at higher price points. Penfolds' 1986 Bin 707 Cabernet Sauvignon was terrific, but few of the store's customers were willing to spend \$25 to try it.

Inevitably, word got out about the great quality of Australia's best wines. More and more of them found their way to America, and by the early 2000s, dropping names like Noon, Glaetzer and Riggs was a sure sign that you were in the know.

Yet a few years later, as quickly as you could say, "Global Financial Crisis," interest in these wines crashed. Many of them disappeared from the American market following 2008. Others lingered on store shelves, over-

priced memories of a passing fling.

Today, American interest in Australia's middle-class and high-end wines is coming back. Even though exchange rate changes mean the wines are no longer the screaming bargains they once were, they can still represent good value. The best combine Australia's beneficent climate, old, ungrafted vines and winemaking skill into modern masterpieces.

This issue's Buying Guide includes a good number of wines that fit that description, as well as a number of Best Buys for \$15 or less. At the macro level, focus on South Australian red wines from the 2010 and 2012 vintages, which look to be the best years for the region in some time.

Although Australia takes center stage this month, we also take a look at other New World regions, including wines from Argentina, California and Oregon. From Europe, we review the latest crop of affordable Bordeaux and Bordeaux Blanc, as well as new releases from Spain, Italy and Germany. And, as always, be sure to check out our online database at buyingguide.winemag.com for thousands more ratings and reviews from around the world. Cheers!

CHARDONNAY

94 Leeuwin Estate 2010 Art Series Chardonnay (Margaret River). Having earned its reputation as one of Australia's finest Chardonnays, the challenge is then to maintain that level of quality. The 2010 Art Series certainly does that. Enticing aromas of woodsmoke, peach and pink grapefruit give way to intense flavors of citrus and stone fruit on the palate. It's full bodied, yet with great focus and length, ending crisply despite the wine's inherent richness. Drink now–2020, perhaps longer. Old Bridge Cellars. —J.C. abv: 14%

Price: \$89

Petaluma 2010 Chardonnay (Piccadilly Valley). This is a lush, ripe Chardonnay from a cool subregion of the Adelaide Hills. Grilled peaches and toasted coconut elements lend an exotic edge to this full-bodied wine. Drink it over the next few years. Distinguished Vineyards & Wine Partners. —J.C. abv: 14% Price: \$33

91 Wolf Blass 2010 White Label Chardonnay (Adelaide Hills). When a producer renowned for its red wines can turn out an elegant, understated white of this quality, you know Australian Chardonnay has firmly arrived. Subtle accents of toasted nuts frame citrusy fruit, and while the wine is full-bodied and round in the mouth, it remains focused and long and on the finish. If you're fortunate enough to get some of the 600 bottles imported, drink the wine over the next couple of years. Treasury Wine Estates. —J.C. abv: 13.5%

90 Penfolds 2010 Yattarna Chardonnay (Tasmania). This is an improvement over the 2009, which was overly lean. The 2010 is still tightly focused

and linear—so much so that one wonders whether it will ever truly flesh out—but bright, citrusy fruit comes through on the long finish, offering hope for the future. Treasury Wine Estates. *Cellar Selection*. —J.C.

abv: 13% **Price:** \$130

Robert Oatley 2010 Chardonnay (Mudgee). Attractive and nicely balanced, featuring hints of toasted marshmallow on the nose but fruitdriven flavors of pineapple and peach on the palate. It's medium-bodied despite its moderate alcohol level, with a lush texture and a juicy, mouthwatering finish. Robert Oatley Vineyards Inc. —J.C.

abv: 12.7% **Price:** \$20

Rosemount 2011 Diamond Label Chardonnay (South Eastern Australia). Harkens back to the value days of the Diamond Label—but the style has been updated to reflect more freshness and focus. Pineapple and melon notes display cool, citrusy overtones, picking up just a hint of caramel on the finish. Drink now. Treasury Wine Estates. Best Buy.—J.C.

abv: 13% **Price:** \$10

Woop Woop 2011 Chardonnay (South Eastern Australia). This is a plump, medium-bodied Chardonnay ideal for casual sipping. Pear and citrus flavors combine easily, finishing on a soft note of chalk-dust. Epicurean Wines.—J.C.

abv: 12.5% **Price:** \$14

85 Salena Estate 2011 Chardonnay (South Eastern Australia). This crisp, citrusy Chardonnay is zesty and refreshing. It avoids any sense of heaviness, finishing on a tart, lemony note. Yancey Marketing Group.—I.C.

abv: 13.5% **Price:** \$11

85 Salena Estate 2011 Legacy Chardonnay (South Eastern Australia). Melon and pear notes provide the flesh, while a citrusy element provides the backbone of this medium-bodied Chardonnay. It's round without being flabby, ending on a refreshing, citrusy note. Drink now. Yancey Marketing Group. Best Buy.—J.C.

abv: 12% **Price:** \$10

84 Lindemans 2011 Bin 65 Chardonnay (South Eastern Australia). A light, clean, fruit-cocktail style of Chardonnay at a bargain price, the 2011 Bin 65 should be largely superseded on shelves by the 2012. Melon and pineapple fruit finishes reasonably crisp, but drink up. Treasury Wine Estates. **Best Buy.**—J.C.

abv: 12.5% **Price:** \$6

Gumdale 2010 Chardonnay (South Eastern Australia). The darkening color and honeyed, butterscotch-like aromas suggest a wine that is entering decline. There's still enough peach and mango fruit to give it some interest, but drink up. Deutsch Family Wine & Spirits. —J.C.

SEMILLON

90 Brokenwood 2007 ILR Reserve Semillon (Hunter Valley). The ILR Reserve continues to be one of the top Hunter Semillons available in the U.S. The 2007 remains youthful, showing a pretty array of citrus aromas and flavors, medium body and a crisp texture. In another few years, this medium-bodied

The Wine Enthusiast Buying Guide

The Buying Guide includes ratings and reviews of new-release and selected older beverage alcohol products evaluated by Wine Enthusiast Magazine's editors and other qualified tasters. Regular contributors to our Buying Guide include Tasting Director Lauren Buzzeo, Executive Editor Susan Kostrzewa, Managing Editor Joe Czerwinski, Contributing Editors Michael Schachner and Anna Lee C. Iijima, Contributing Taster Andrew Hoover and Spirits Editor Kara Newman in New York, European Editor Roger Voss in Bordeaux, Italian Editor Kerin O'Keefe in Switzerland, California Editor Steve Heimoff in Oakland, Contributing Editor Virginie Boone in Santa Rosa, Contributing Editor Paul Gregutt in Waitsburg and Contributing Editor Sean Sullivan in Seattle.

If a wine was evaluated by a single reviewer, that taster's initials appear following the note. When no initials appear following a wine review, the wine was evaluated by two or more reviewers and the score and tasting note reflect the input of all tasters. Unless otherwise stated, all Spirits Reviews are by Kara Newman and all beer reviews are by Lauren Buzzeo.

Each review contains a score, the full name of the product, its suggested national retail price, its abv as reported to us by the submitter and a tasting note. If price or alcohol content cannot be confirmed, NA (not available) will be printed. Prices are for 750-ml bottles unless otherwise indicated.

TASTING METHODOLOGY AND GOALS

All tastings reported in the Buying Guide are performed blind unless otherwise noted. Typically, products are tasted in peer-group flights of from 5–8 samples. Price is not a factor in assigning scores. When possible, products considered flawed or uncustomary are retasted.

ABOUT THE SCORES

Ratings reflect what our editors felt about a particular product. Beyond the rating, we encourage you to read the accompanying tasting note to learn about a product's special characteristics.

Classic 98-100: The pinnacle of quality. Superb 94-97: A great achievement. Excellent 90-93: Highly recommended.

Very Good 87-89: Often good value; well recommended. Good 83-86: Suitable for everyday consumption;

often good value.

Acceptable 80–82: Can be employed in casual, less-

critical circumstances

Products deemed Unacceptable (receiving a rating below 80 points) are not reviewed.

SPECIAL DESIGNATIONS

Editors' Choice products are those that offer excellent quality at a price above our Best Buy range, or a product at any price with unique qualities that merit special attention.

Cellar Selections are products deemed highly collectible and/or requiring time in a temperature-controlled wine cellar to reach their maximum potential. A Cellar Selection designation does not mean that a product must be stored to be enjoyed, but that cellaring will probably result in a more enjoyable bottle. In general, an optimum time for cellaring will be indicated.





Williams Selyem 2011 Precious Mountain Vineyard Pinot Noir (Sonoma Coast).

Williams Selvem expresses the intricacies of this vineyard with more consistency than any other winery. This remarkably intellectual, ageworthy wine is bone dry, with marked acidity and complexity. The flavors range from wild cherries, cola and balsam to raspberry tart and buttered cinnamon toast. Its complexity is like a mandala, increasing in beauty the longer one examines it. A softly tannic bitterness lingers on the finish; drink 2019–2030. Cellar Selection. —S.H.

Williams Selyem 2011 Allen Vineyard Pi-96 not Noir (Russian River Valley). You can taste the California sun in every sip of this gorgeous Pinot Noir. It brims with luscious raspberries and cherries accented by brisk acidity and a hint of sweet, smoky oak. It's terrifically complex, with notes of mushroom, orange zest, cola, rosehip tea and persimmon. Dry and elegant, with a wonderful mouthfeel, it's gorgeous now, but will gain earthy complexity over the next 15 years. Cellar Selection. —S.H.


John Duval Wines 2010 Eligo Shiraz (Barossa). This is likely the most ageworthy Shiraz winemaker John Duval has crafted since leaving Penfolds. The oak is subtle, the fruit still tight. It's full bodied but bursting with potential, shown in hints of black cherries and plums, mocha and mint. The finish is long, mouthwatering and softly dusty in texture, making it luscious vet firm. Drink 2018-2030. Old Bridge Cellars. Cellar Selection. — J.C.

Trefethen 2008 HaLo Cabernet Sauvignon (Oak Knoll). Trefethen has been on a roll the last few years, producing some of Napa's most spectacular Cabernets. This bottling, which contains minor quantities of Petit Verdot and Merlot, spent 28 months in new French oak barrels. The fruit is incredibly ripe and intense, with flavors of black currants and chocolate-covered cherries. As hard as the tannins are, they must have been even more aggressive two or three years ago, so kudos to Trefethen for holding the bottle back for five years. This beauty is just now beginning its long journey. Drink now-2020. Cellar Selection. —S.H.

95 Williams Selyem 2011 Hirsch Vineyard Pinot Noir (Sonoma Coast). One sip is all it takes to be blown away by this Pinot's beauty. It's exquisitely crafted, a testament to both the vineyard and the winery's oenological talent. The palate is bright and tangy with acidity, and incredibly complex flavors of wild berries, mushrooms, balsam, cola and Asian spices. It's dramatic now, but will continue to improve for at least 15 years. Cellar Selection. —S.H.


MONTEFALCO SAGRANTINO

Tenuta Castelbuono 2007 Sagrantino di **Montefalco.** This stunning offering is aged in large casks that soften the wine but don't add wood tannins to Sagrantino's naturally tannic backbone. It opens with an intensely balsamic fragrance of Mediterranean herbs, mint and berry accompanied by delicious blackberry, white pepper and cinnamon flavors. The wine boasts fantastic depth and will develop even more complexity over time. Drink 2017-2027. Palm Bay International. Editors' Choice. - K.O.



94 Williams Selyem 2011 Bacigalupi Vineyard Zinfandel (Russian River Valley).

This is a medium-bodied Zinfandel, with elegant weight and mouthfeel. The flavors are classic—wild raspberries and cherries, cola, cocoa and exotic spices. This is surely one of the best Zinfandels of the vintage. —S.H.

94 Williams Selyem 2011 Drake Estate Vineyard Chardonnay (Russian River Valley).

This small-production Chardonnay (only 272 cases) is exceptionally rich and ripe, as Williams Selyem Chardonnays consistently are. Intense flavors of tropical fruit and pear pie (with a smoky, buttery crust) make for a powerful palate. The acidity is mouthwatering. This is the ideal wine for cracked crab and a sourdough baguette with butter. —S.H.


93 Rings 2006 Reserve Shiraz (Barossa Valley). It's not often you find mature, readyto-drink Shiraz like this newly released in the U.S. From extended time in oak, this has some mossy, vanilla shadings on the nose that ease gently into savory, meaty notes and dried plum flavors. Hints of brown sugar, chocolate and mint linger on the supple finish. Drink now and over the next few years. Quintessential Wines. *Editors' Choice.*—I.C.

93 Gary Farrell 2011 Hallberg Vineyard Dijon Clone 777 7% Whole Cluster Pinot Noir (Russian River Valley). This elaborately named Pinot shows Farrell's 2011 signature of rich, brooding earthiness. Tasted now it's a bit clumsy, with raspberry, cherry, mushroom and oak flavors that are scattered and random. With time, it will collect itself seamlessly. Age it for 6–8 years. *Cellar Selection*. —S.H.

Gary Farrell 2011 Hallberg Vineyard Dijon Clones Pinot Noir (Russian River Val-

ley). Here's a Pinot to enjoy over the years. Right now, it's all about primary fruit—raspberries, cherries and Dr. Pepper cola. But the balance is terrific, and there's a brooding quality that bodes well for the future as it develops more secondary characteristics. Drink from 2015–2019. *Cellar Selection.*—S.H.

Marimar Estate 2010 Mas Cavalls Doña Margarita Vineyard Unfiltered Pinot Noir (Sonoma Coast). This is dry and tart with acidity, yet rich in fruit. It's a deliciously drinkable wine now, but capable of improving with extended cellaring. With cherry, pomegranate, cola and sweet oak flavors, it finishes with superb balance and charm. Drink now–2020. Cellar Selection. —S.H.


Marimar Estate 2010 Stony Block Don Miguel Vineyard Unfiltered Pinot Noir (Russian River Valley). What distinguishes the Stony Block from the winery's other selections is its minerality, but also a fluidity in the wine—as if the rocks were melted into the fruit. The raspberry, pomegranate and cola flavors are classic. This surely is a wine to age. Drink from 2016 and beyond. Cellar Selection. —S.H.


Marqués de Elciego 2010 Edición Limitada (Rioja). Talk about a ripped, structured wine that could use more rest. This pumps out minerally blackberry and coconut aromas along with raw, inky intensity. The wine's texture is defined by a strong tannic backbone, while flavors of burnt toast, bacon, licorice and black fruits finish with graphite and energy. Drink from 2015–2023. Quintessential Wines. Cellar Selection. —M.S.


93 Ponzi 2011 Reserve Chardonnay (Willamette Valley). One of the best values in highend Oregon Chardonnay, this new release packs a wallop. Although just 15% of the French oak was new, the wine is loaded with toasty, buttery scents and flavors. Let it breathe and the ripe fruit flavors zoom into focus—candied citrus, apricot and a bit of lemon meringue pie. **Editors' Choice.**—P.G.


Williams Selyem 2011 Allen Vineyard Chardonnay (Russian River Valley). The wine shows the fine acidity of the vintage, but also intense flavors of green apples, Asian pears and oranges. Oak brings luscious, balanced notes of vanilla and toast. A gorgeous, sumptuous wine that should drink well for the next six years. —S.H.

Williams Selyem 2011 Coastlands Vineyard Pinot Noir (Sonoma Coast). Is this Pinot so delicious now you should drink it right away? Or is it deceptively ageable? Both. It's luscious, with ripe raspberry, cola, spice, mushroom and sandalwood flavors that will be gorgeous with steak. But the tannins and acid are so structured, the wine will gracefully age through the next dozen years, increasing in complexity. Cellar Selection. —S.H.



Williams Selvem 2011 Hawk Hill Vineyard Chardonnay (Russian River Valley).

This beautiful wine could be from Chablis. It's so dry and flinty, with complex layers of lemons, limes, toast and honey, along with mouthwateringly brisk acidity. As delicious as the wine is now, you might want to cellar it for a few years. Cellar Selection. —S.H.

Williams Selyem 2011 Williams Selyem Estate Vineyard Pinot Noir (Russian River Valley). While this Pinot isn't in the same league as the winery's 2011 Precious Mountain or Allen vineyard wines, it's a gorgeous wine nonetheless. With moderate alcohol and vibrant acidity, it offers complex layers of cherries, raspberries, cola, sandalwood and exotic spices. You won't be disappointed if you hold it until 2019. Cellar Selection. —S.H.

Conn Creek 2009 Stagecoach Vineyard **92** Conn Creek 2009 Stages Peak). The Cabernet Sauvignon (Atlas Peak). winery has held this 100% Cabernet back for more than four years to let it mellow, but it's still a burly wine. Hard tannins mark the blackberry, currant and dark chocolate flavors. There's an elegance that persists, however, giving strong indications of ageability. Hold until at least 2016, but it could be still be rocking in 2025. Cellar Selection. -S.H.

Marimar Estate 2010 Dobles Lías Don Miguel Vineyard Unfiltered Chardonnay (Russian River Valley). The Dobles Lías has more lees contact than Marimar's other Chardonnays, giving it a rich, yeasty creaminess. There's also plenty of new French oak influence. Made from estate-grown fruit, it's rich with papayas, tangerines and guavas. It's delicious now, but has all the structure a Chardonnay needs to negotiate the next eight years. -S.H.

92 Marimar Estate 2009 Cristina Don Miguel Vineyard Unfiltered Pinot Noir (Russian River Valley). A blend of the best barrels of wine sourced from the Don Miguel Vineyard, Cristina is named for Marimar Torres's daughter. This exceptionally rich wine will reward at least 6-8 years in the cellar. It's concentrated, with notes of raspberries, cherries, pomegranates and rhubarb, all framed by significant tannins. The overall mouthfeel is elegant and weighty. Cellar Selection. —S.H.

Estate Grown & Bottled

92 Marimar Estate 2012 Don Miguel Vineyard Estate Grown and Bottled Chardonnay-Albariño (Russian River Valley). There's quite a bit of new French oak used in this blend, adding complexity in the form of buttered toast notes. But the wine is really all about fruit—massive flavors of limes, Meyer lemons, apricots, oranges, pineapples, peaches and honey. While that sounds like a laundry list, if you pay attention you'll find each strand of the tapestry. At the same time, it's bone dry and balanced with acidity. Don't drink it too cold. Editors' Choice. - S.H.




Parallel 2010 Fortune Teller Cabernet 92 Parallel 2010 1 of table Sauvignon (Napa Valley). This 100% Cabernet Sauvignon is so rich and decadent, with milk chocolate, blackberry and new French oak flavors. Made by celebrity winemaker Philippe Melka, it's soft and approacheable on the palate and widely appealing. Your best bet is to drink up now. —S.H.



92 Williams Selyem 2011 Bucher Vineyard Pinot Noir (Russian River Valley). Raspberries, cherries, cola, exotic spices and sweet cedar mark the flavors of this Pinot Noir. It's elegant in the mouth, with brisk acidity, but also a distinct earthiness. The combination gives the wine a yin-yang of weight and weightlessness. It's too young to properly enjoy now, so drink from 2019 and beyond. **Cellar Selection.**—S.H.



92 Williams Selyem 2011 Rochioli Riverblock Vineyard Pinot Noir (Russian River

Valley). Tart cranberry acidity marks this dry, delicately structured young wine. Dusty with tannins, the mouthfeel is tight and nervous. At the core are complex layers of forest berries, cola, mushrooms, exotic baking spices and sweet cedar. Give the wine at least six years in a cellar to mature—it should be flying high by 2029. **Cellar Selection.**—S.H.

91 Arrowood 2011 Saralee's Vineyard Viognier (Russian River Valley). This bottling from Arrowood is dependably rich, showing Viognier's exotic tropical fruit, peach, apricot, honeysuckle, vanilla cream and cinnamon flavors. The 2011 is dry and balanced, with crisp acidity. Drink it now.—S.H.

91 D'Arenberg 2010 d'Arry's Original Shiraz-Grenache (McLaren Vale). A terrific value, this 50-50 blend displays gentle oaking and a hint of warm asphalt, just enough to highlight the wine's plum and black cherry fruit. It's full bodied and features a long finish, outlined by wonderfully fine, dusty tannins. Drink now–2018. Old Bridge Cellars. *Editors' Choice*. —I.C.

91 Draxton 2009 Cabernet Sauvignon (Dry Creek Valley). With a wealth of cherry, cassis, mocha and sandalwood flavors, this is one of the best Dry Creek Cabernets in recent memory. The rich flavors are wrapped into firm, dry tannins that give the mouthfeel a fine grippiness. There's no reason to age this beauty, but it will hold for a good six years. —S.H. abv: 14.4%

91 El Roy 2012 Nelson Vineyards Sauvignon Blanc (Dry Creek Valley). Run, don't walk, to find this Sauvignon Blanc. It's delicious, and available for such a great price! The palate treads an exciting line between ripe peach, citrus, green apple and honey flavors, and a tangy, flinty minerality. The acidity is mouthwatering. Only 550 cases were produced, but it's worth a search. *Editors' Choice*.—S.H.


91 Lucienne 2011 Lone Oak Vineyard Pinot Noir (Santa Lucia Highlands). This is a joy to drink. It's dry and silky, with savory raspberry, cherry and cola flavors that are accented by earthy notes of sautéed wild mushrooms, balsamic and soy sauce. It should improve even more with a few years in the bottle.—S.H.

91 Marimar Estate 2012 Acero Don Miguel Vineyard Unoaked Chardonnay (Russian River Valley). This is Marimar's unoaked Chardonnay from the estate vineyard. FLAVOR OF THE MONTH: FLAVORED WHISKEYS

hink back just a couple of years: flavored whiskies weren't much of a category.

But look at the shelves today. Inspired by the strong success of flavored vodkas, the flavored whiskey category has roared to life. For this month's tastings, flavors ranged from fruity to vanilla- and cinnamon-spiced; maple to salted caramel. (No cupcake-flavored whiskies yet—whew!) The unspoken rule seems to be this: find a flavor that exists in the natural spectrum of whiskey, and amp it up.

In general, the bases of these products are younger spirits, and they're intended for cocktails (cola or ginger ale seem to be the go-to mixers here). Canadian whiskey used to be the primary foundation for flavored products, but that's no longer the case, as bases now range from Irish whiskey to rye to unaged American moonshine.

It would be a challenge to compare these young whiskies side by side with their fine, longaged counterparts. In many ways, it's comparable to the intersection between aged rums and

spiced rums: "fine" versus "fun."

Of course, there are exceptions to every rule. California wine-and-spirits maker, Charbay, bucks the young-whiskey trend by distilling beer and aging it for extended periods to create intriguing "hop-flavored" whiskies. Two are included here, although some might argue they belong in a different category from whiskies with flavoring added after distillation.

These flavored whiskies are drawing in tipplers who are new to whiskey altogether. Some experts refer to them as "starter whiskies"—if you try and enjoy maple-flavored Bourbon, distillers reason, perhaps you'll be more likely to try unflavored Bourbon down the road.

We're all for that kind of experimentation at Wine Enthusiast, so if you find a flavored whiskey here you like, consider heading over to our online Buying Guide at buyingguide.winemag. com to locate an unflavored whiskey you might enjoy too.

Q5 Charbay Hop Flavored Whiskey—Release III 1999 (USA; Charbay Distillers, Ukiah, CA). Double-distilled from Pilsner beer, flavored with hops and aged for 14 years (six years in oak, eight years out of oak), this limited-edition whiskey isn't for everyone. It's powerful, big and oaky on the palate, with lots of tannins rounding out into vanilla, honey and sweet-yet-bitter orange peel. Bottled at an over-the-top 132 proof, it needs a lot of dilution, but once the alcohol is tamed, an enticing velvetiness emerges. This whiskey is different, interesting and oddly haunting. It would make a wild Manhattan.

93 Jim Beam Maple (USA; James B. Beam Distilling Company, Frankfort, KY). This maple-flavored Bourbon features rich and sweet maple and vanilla aromas and flavors, plus a lingering butterscotch note. A flicker of heat on the finish reminds one there's actually whiskey in there, and serves to balance out the sweetness with cinnamon and ginger sparks. Surprisingly addictive, this is one of the few flavored whiskies that works equally well mixed or sipped straight up. **Best Buy**.

92 Knob Creek Smoked Maple (USA; Knob Creek Distillery, Clermont, KY). Whiskey first, flavoring second in this bottle. DARK AND ROASTY

ith winter in full swing, we typically turn to robust beverage selections that help keep us cozy and warm throughout the chilly nights. We look for bolder flavors, stronger profiles, and maybe even higher alcohol levels to provide that wonderful warming sensation as we enjoy our favorite cold one. One of the best beer styles that grants all of these characteristics is American porters.

Originally perceived as lighter stouts (just as a stout was perceived to be a stronger version of a porter), porters can vary widely, from bitter, roasty beers to sweeter, chocolaty versions and everything in between. Interpretation and personalization is key.

There are more traditional offerings, like

English or Baltic porters, and then there are American craft versions, which often use additional ingredients (like coffee or smoked malts) or techniques (like oak ageing).

These American examples are the focus of our tastings this month. The style lines are blurred, as innovative brewers think outside the box and experiment with different recipes and methods. Some American brewers have even taken to producing imperial porters, offering more intensity, concentration, bitterness and, of course, alcohol.

Perfect for those cold winter nights, here are some great brews to start off your porter journey.

Alaskan Brewing Co. 2013 Smoked Porter (American Porter; Alaskan Brewing Co., AK). A perennial classic, Alaskan Brewing's vintage-dated Smoked Porter continues to impress. The 2013 bottling seems to have even more depth and power than usual, with intense aromas of char and campfire upfront, supported by notes of chocolate, cigar box, roasted malt and a hint of dark fruit. It's a deep, dark brown color-almost black-with a fluffy tan head that lingers. The palate is smooth, full and creamy, with lush flavors that mimic the bouquet alongside accents of hickory-cured bacon, roasted coffee and s'mores. A sweet-smoke sensation lingers on the long finish; with this concentration, power and balance, this is a selection that's sure to evolve and age well for years to come. Cellar Selection.

abv: 6.5% **Price:** \$9/22 oz

92 Hangar 24 Barrel Roll No. 01 2013 Immelmann (American Imperial Porter; Hangar 24 Craft Brewery, CA). This Bourbonbarrel-aged imperial porter is brewed with lots of malts, including chocolate and dark chocolate malts, as well as oats, cocoa nibs and whole vanilla beans. It's aged in Bourbon barrels for six months, then blended with 20% fresh porter to retain some of the initial beer's characteristics and prevent the wood from overpowering the profile. The result is an intense but well balanced selection, brimming with powerful aromas and flavors of vanilla, roasted coffee, sweet wood, baking spice, cocoa, molasses and dried dark plums and berries. This beer is medium bodied, with low carbonation and a spicy warmth on the finish. Only 2520 bottles were produced. Although it's enjoyable now, the intensity should mellow and flavors will evolve with some cellaring time. Cellar Selection.

abv: 11.4% **Price:** \$20/750 ml

90 Stone Smoked Porter with Vanilla Bean (American Porter; Stone Brewing Co.,

CA). This porter pours a dark brown color, with faint hints of walnut-mahogany when held up to the light. Initial aromas are as expected—roasted malt, vanilla, charred oak and faint sweet smoke. The palate is smooth and savory, with forward flavors of vanilla bean, coffee, roasted walnut shells and chocolate malted-milk balls. A touch of bitterness and a subtle, welcome warmth on the finish make it an ideal selection for chilly winter nights.

abv: 5.9% **Price:** \$8/22 oz

Stone 2013 Collaboration Stone-10 Stone 2013 Collaboration.

Barrel-Bluejacket Suede Imperial Porter (American Imperial Porter; Stone Brewing Co., CA). This ale, brewed with calendula flowers, jasmine and avocado honey, pours a deep brown color with a serious head that lingers. Initial aromas of mocha waft from the glass, while dried floral and whole hop flower accents unfold and hold their own. The palate is smooth and rich, with a silky, suede-like texture (hence the name?) that's complemented by soft warmth and ample bitterness on the finish. The palate is full of traditional porter flavors-roasted malt, bitter chocolate and coffee—but interestingly accented by notes of honey, caramel and fragrant white flowers. Flavors of dried red fruits and cocoa powder linger on the close, along with a soft, resinous slick.

abv: 9.6% **Price:** \$8/22 oz

Panut Butter Porter (American Porter; DuClaw Brewing Co., MD). If you like peanut butter—and I mean really like peanut butter—then this beer might be for you. The aromas and flavors are so pungent and intense that chocolaty peanut butter is pretty much all you get. Despite the rich flavor, it's fairly bright on the palate, with medium carbonation and a mocha-flavored finish that could be compared to a Manhattan Special soda.
