90 pts “A dark, brooding red, sporting blackberry and black currant flavors. At once smooth and dense, with intense fruit and a long, blackberry-stained finish.”

90 pts “The 2008 Marmorecchia (Syrah) is beautiful. It isn't especially varietally expressive, rather it is a wine that speaks more to the intense minerality of the vintage and the qualities of this site. Plums, black cherries, menthol and spices flesh out on the finish. Anticipated maturity: 2012-2016.”

88 pts “Dark ruby-red. Reticent nose hints at deep red cherry with perfumed notes of black and white pepper. Rich and creamy in the mouth, with sweet spice and floral flavors carrying through on the persistent finish. Marmorecchia is the ancient name of the location where this wine is made, which features rich calcareous soil that looks like marble. Antonini uses 30% whole clusters for this wine because he finds syrah to be too fruity for his taste.”
