97 pts “Bright purple-red hue; elegance is the key word for this medium-bodied wine, elegance expressed by its fusion of red and black fruits, licorice, multi spices, and superbly silky but continuous tannins.”

92 pts “Vivid ruby. A compelling bouquet of black and blue fruits, violet, Szechuan peppercorn and minerals, with a hint of olive. Smells quite a bit like a wine from the northern Rhone. Offers intense boysenberry and bitter cherry flavors and notes of candied flowers and spicecake. Spicy and precise on a finish that strongly echoes the blue fruit and floral notes.”

91+ pts “A blend of 97% Shiraz and 3% Viognier, co-fermented in small open top tanks and then aged in French oak, 25% new, for 19 months, the 2010 Shiraz gives a medium to deep garnet-purple color with notes of ripe red cherries, blackberries and cassis over hints of menthol, cedar, anise and cloves. A pleasant savory character comes through on the palate supported by lively acid and a medium to firm level of rounded tannins, finishing long. Approachable now, it should soften and expand over the next 5-7 years and drink to 2020+.”
