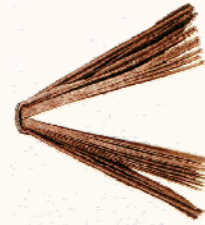


2007 OCCAM'S RAZOR SHIRAZ

Review Summary



93 pts “The 2007 Occam’s Razor Shiraz was fermented naturally and aged for 13-14 months in 20% new French and American oak. Opaque purple-colored, it delivers a super-fragrant nose of Asian spices, incense, espresso, blueberry, and black cherry. This leads to a full-bodied, dense, very rich, yet elegant wine with superb concentration, great balance, and 6-8 years of aging potential. It should be at its best from 2015 to 2027. At the asking price, it is an incredible value in high-class Shiraz.”

Tough to crack, with strong finishing licorice and mineral character and a lingering cherry pit note. Give this plenty of cellar time.”
