91+ pts “Vivid ruby. Seductive nose suggests black raspberry, cola, licorice, pungent herbs and spicecake. Dense but nicely delineated, with a firm structure and a peppery nuance to its bright red and dark berry flavors. Closes down with aeration and finishes with very good grip and a hint of bitter cherry. This wine needs some bottle age.”
