89 pts “Pale straw. An intensely fruity, exotic bouquet evokes passion fruit, tangerine, quince and jasmine, along with a gingery overtone. Fleshy and expansive on the palate, offering juicy tropical and citrus fruit flavors and a hint of bitter quinine that adds cut. Closes supple and quite long, with slow-building spiciness and very good clarity.”

“At first sip, I enjoyed a lemony minerality. With some air, the lemon gave way to pear and quince while maintaining its Sauvignon Blanc identity. As I continued sipping, and the air softened the wine, I picked up a taste of kiwi.
