Review Summary



90 pts “Planted in the late 19th century and was the first to have a trellis above knee height. The standard modus operandi of d'Arenberg works well here, with soft tannins and integrated oak woven through the fresh cassis fruit flavors of the light-bodied palate.”

89 pts “Opaque ruby. Dark berries, cherry pit and pipe tobacco on the pungent nose, with a peppery element adding vivacity. Energetic blackberry and bitter cherry flavors show good clarity and a hint of licorice that builds with air. The tangy finish reveals repeating pepper and licorice notes, supple tannins and good length.”
