

## 2009 d'ARENBERG THE WILD PIXIE

## **Review Summary**



**91 pts - Year's Best Australian Shiraz** "Roussanne does add a wildness to Shiraz's fruit flavors in this wine, a saturated raspberry brightness deepened by blackberry, blueberry...It's tightly structured, floral and finishes clean."

**90 pts** "Blended of 94% Shiraz and 6% Roussanne, the 2009 The Wild Pixie Shiraz Roussanne gives a medium-deep garnet-purple color and notes of mulberries and warm blackberries over forest floor, damp loam, jasmine tea and cinnamon stick. Full-bodied with plenty of ripe fruit, it has a solid backbone of crisp acid and medium-firm chewy tannins, finishing long. Drink it now to 2015+."
