



2010 JOHN DUVAL ELIGO SHIRAZ

WINEMAKER: John Duval

REGION: Barossa and Eden Valleys, South Australia

VARIETALS: Shiraz

MATURATION: 20 months in 100% French oak (75% new)

ANALYSIS: 14.5% alc/vol | TA: 6.6 g/L | pH: 3.5

ELIGO: To choose or select, a selection of the very best; "best of vintage"

VINTAGE:

Barossa received its best winter rains for five years. The 2010 growing season started cool and mild, but in November experienced a week of unseasonal hot weather, resulting in reduced fruit set and yield for some red varieties, but Shiraz was largely unaffected. A good soaking rain followed the heat, allowing vine canopies to recover. Temperatures through December and January were average. Varasion began slightly earlier in January, and with good vine balance, ripening was even and early. 2010 vintage was condensed and finished by the end of March.

WINEMAKING:

Eligo epitomizes John's unparalleled knowledge of Barossa's terrior and fruit. Traditional, low-intervention winemaking techniques ensure that this flagship wine is full of finesse and character. Submerged-cap fermentation takes place in small, stainless steel fermenters with a small portion undergoing extended maceration for up to two weeks to maximize color and flavor extraction.


TASTING NOTES:

The nose is youthful and expressive with notes of blackberry, blueberry and dark chocolate. The palate is intense but still restrained, with impressive structure and vibrant dark fruit intensity. Eligo will age well for at least fifteen years under proper cellaring conditions.
