Closed and taut on opening, but after a while subtle red fruits emerge along with tea, spice and minerals. Balanced and complex with a strong savory streak. Attractive, elegant and distinctive.”

★★★★1/2 “While Jane Eyre’s 2011 Savigny-les-Beaune was from a single vineyard, this wine is from three premier cru vineyards. It’s no less interesting. It’s fully de-stemmed (so no stalks, which are so hot in local pinot noir right now), sees no new oak, and its earthy, graphite aromas include raspberry, strawberry and plum. Smooth and elegant, there’s zip and tension along with delightful light red fruit flavors.”

“Savigny has a tendency to deliver rustic, earthy and chewy wines that can struggle to achieve definition and detail. Not so here, this wine is wild and brambly, nicely defined and perfumed on the nose with light red fruits, bright toasted brown spices, a sweep of herbs and a gently chalky edge. The palate is chirpy and bright offering taut red fruit with a centerpiece of tart, punchy acidity framed in "ne layers of beautifully ripe tannins. It’s undeniably elegant, refreshing stuff.”
