91 pts “Hand-picked, heavy bottle, leesy/yeasty complexity, enough fruit intensity but a clear sense that savoriness is a high priority. It's successful in its ambitions, if not spectacularly so. Lemon, pear, yeast, apple and nectarine but with a hand on the volume control, inching to turn it anticlockwise. Tastes though like the wine of a good year. Excellent composure.”
