



2013 PLANTAGENET RIESLING

Review Summary



94 pts “The wine is predominantly sourced from the Wyjup Vineyard (43-year-old vines), fleshed out with lesser amounts from two local vineyards which add complexity to the profile. The wine is a little bit behind the all-conquering '12 Riesling, but is seriously good, with a fragrant, flowery, lime blossom-filled bouquet, a long palate gaining strength and energy on the finish, with touches of slate and talc forming part of the impact of acidity.”
