95 pts “Deepish red/purple color, bright. Fresh, clean plummy aromas laced with a subtle touch of oak. The palate is rich and textural, with a good balance of savory and fruity elements. Quite deep and fleshy, with fruit sweetness hiding behind ample tannins and lots of flavor depth. Lovely perfume. More delicate than the Sexton vineyard. A very good wine indeed.”

94 pts “Tried the 2012 Applejack the other night, and gee it’s a good wine. This 2013 iteration is quite different. Deep rich dark cherry and raspberry, sage, pepper and spices, meat and a little creamy oak. Medium bodied, so silky and fine in the mouth – glides smoother than Tom Cruise in socks and undies – minerally, clear acidity and meaty complexity. It’s full and round, yet fresh and clean too. Not the uncompromising charisma of the 2012, more mainstream, but still the vineyard is in the main. Almost al dente tannin on the finish, with a pretty sweet rose perfume echoing in the aftertaste. Very good.”

92 pts “Bright red. Sexy, complex scents of raspberry compote, cola, incense and peppery spices. Silky and expansive on the palate, offering sweet red fruit and floral pastille flavors that pick up a smoky nuance with air.
