

2010 d'ARENBERG d'ARRY'S ORIGINAL

WINEMAKER :	Chester Osborn
REGION :	McLaren Vale, South Australia
VARIETALS :	Shiraz (50%), Grenache (50%)
MATURATION :	2/3 for 12-21 months in new & older French & American barriques, 1/3 large oak casks
ANALYSIS :	14.4% alc/vol 6.2 g/L TA 3.37 pH

THE ART OF BEING DIFFERENT :

This wine is named in honor of d'Arenberg's principal, Francis d'Arry d'Arenberg Osborn, whose winemaking career began at this family winery more than a half a century ago. d'Arry's blend, launched some four decades ago, continues as it began - a blend of Shiraz and Grenache sourced from d'Arenberg's own low-yielding, 19th century vineyards.

WINEMAKING :

Small batches are crushed in the Demoisy open-mouthed, rubber toothed crusher and then transferred to five ton headed-down open fermenters. These batches remain separate until final blending. Foot treading is undertaken two thirds of the way through fermentation. When tannin extraction is just right the wine is basket pressed and transferred to oak barriques as well as large casks to complete primary and secondary fermentation and is aged on lees to keep the wine fresh while also reducing the oak influence. There is no racking until final blending.

TASTING NOTES :

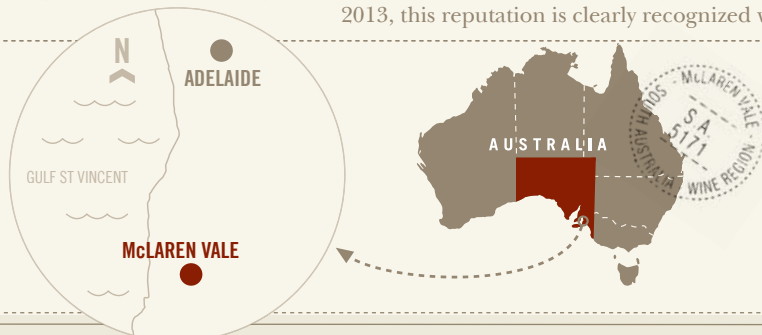
Immediately on the nose one is struck by a complex array of dark, sweet and savory notes - plums, licorice, nutmeg and a subtle hint of cedar. The palate is typical of the vintage, concentrated and round, with velvety tannins, although still a touch of those beautiful, fine, gritty tannins so typical of d'Arenberg Grenache. The flavor profile develops in glass, opening up with luscious mulberry and plum, laced with earthy notes and cured meats.
