Review Summary



95 pts “An estate-grown 64/36% blend; wild-fermented and matured in French oak (70%) new for 6 months, no acid additions made, and minimal fining. It is quite extraordinary how the wine has absorbed the oak, perhaps one of the factors emboldening Vanya Cullen to suggest a 15-year cellaring proposition - not so scary if you look at 15yo White Bordeaux.”

92 pts “Light, hazy yellow. Smoky, assertively perfumed aromas of poached pear, melon and lemon curd are complemented by suggestions of fennel, jasmine and vanilla. Supple and broad on entry, then more taut in the middle, offering juicy orchard fruit and orange zest flavors and a hint of toasty lees. Shows a suave blend of power and finesse and finishes sappy, smoky and very long, with a sexy floral quality. This complex wine reminded me a lot of a top-notch white Bordeaux.”
