92 pts “Brilliant ruby-red. A powerfully scented bouquet evokes ripe red and dark berries, potpourri, licorice and Indian spice, and a mineral topnote adds vivacity. Powerful but graceful as well, offering juicy black raspberry and bitter cherry flavors that become livelier and sweeter as the wine opens up. Silky, even tannins come in late on the dark-fruit-driven finish, which hangs on with impressive focus and tenacity.”
