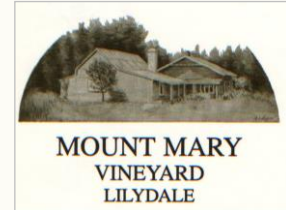




2010 MOUNT MARY QUINTET

Densely packed and sharply delineated, with bright acidity adding lift and cut to the wine's bitter cherry and cassis flavors.
