This is undeniably very complex, shouting its Hunter Valley terroir from the rooftops. It has a diamond-cut angularity to its mouthfeel common to all of the ‘13 Brokenwood Shirazes.”

92 pts “Deep ruby. Complex, highly perfumed bouquet evokes fresh dark berries, floral pastilles, musky underbrush and allspice, with a mineral element adding interest. Sweet, focused and lithe on the palate, offering energetic black raspberry and cherry-cola flavors that turn deeper and sweeter on the back half. Combines power and vivacity effortlessly and finishes juicy and very long, with fine-grained tannins gently shaping the wine’s nervy dark fruit.”
