92 pts “Dark ruby. Powerful aromas of dark berries, potpourri and smoky minerals develop a spicy nuance in the glass. Gently sweet and concentrated, showing a velvety texture to the sappy blackberry and cherry liqueur flavors. A stony nuance adds lift and definition, as well as refreshing cut. Finishes with strong fruity thrust and supple, late-arriving tannins that meld smoothly with the sweet fruit.”
