94 pts “Deeply colored, its roots grown in the very low yield across southern Victoria (small bunches, small berries), and in the winery, where the decision was to let the wine speak for itself. Thus it is full-bodied in pinot terms, the fruits purple and black, not red. Prolonged cellaring is on offer for those with the patience needed.”
