



## 2013 d'ARENBERG THE DERELICT VINEYARD GRENACHE

WINEMAKER :	Chester Osborn
REGION :	McLaren Vale, South Australia
VARIETALS :	Grenache
MATURATION :	12 months in older American & French oak barriques
ANALYSIS :	14.2% alc/vol   7.3g/L TA   3.40 pH

### THE ART OF BEING DIFFERENT :

Some years ago Chester Osborn, sought out additional premium Grenache fruit from McLaren Vale to meet the high demand for d'Arenberg's Grenache-based wines. Many old vineyards showed promise but had not been used for grape production for decades; the vines resembled Medusa's hair - wild, struggling and gnarled. The taming and rejuvenation of these vineyards has occurred over several years, but the results have been dramatic, with the gnarly old vines producing fruit of amazing density and richness.

### WINEMAKING :

The low-yielding Grenache fruit was hand-picked, and after gentle crushing in the 'Demoisy' crusher, separate parcels were fermented in traditional headed-down open fermenters. These batches remain separate until final blending. Gentle pressing took place in 19th century basket-presses with fermentation completed in barrels.

### TASTING NOTES :

The 2013 Derelict Vineyard is simply a delicious drink, a fine example of the resurgence in popularity of McLaren Vale Grenache. The nose and palate are brimming with sweet, pure fruits. Stewed rhubarb, fresh blueberry and raspberry jubes. A faint whiff of spice and an ever so mild earthiness add complexity. Generous and juicy at first then tied together with a fine gritty tannin that adds length, savoriness and minerality.

One of the undisputed kings of Australian Shiraz and Rhone varietals, d'Arenberg has managed to turn individuality into an art form by doing a whole lot of little things differently. A century on, the estate has grown to 345 acres, and the mantle now rests with fourth-generation winemaker Chester Osborn.
