93 pts “Deep crimson-purple, it shouts McLaren Vale from the rooftops, dark chocolate wrapped thickly around the black fruits. This is purely a regional signature, and cannot be regarded as a fault (as mintiness can be). The overall flavor and texture has a gently savory note that comes through on the finish.”
