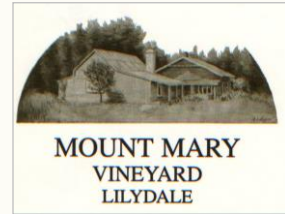




2015 MOUNT MARY QUINTET

Review Summary



98 pts “A superb wine from the very first impression, showing a lot of ripe cassis, leafy notes, chocolate and cedar. Hints of graphite, red plums, redcurrants, too. Merlot is back in the mix and it has higher percentage in the blend (30% to 44% cabernet sauvignon). The palate is silky, smooth, really slick and supple. A beautifully balanced wine here. Long, regal, suave and showy. Layered and full of interest.”

The nose delivers an array of blueberries, cassis and redder berry fruits wrapped in gently leafy nuances and some fresh earthy and spicy notes. There’s plenty in the mix. The palate’s refined and resolved with tannins flying in formation and casting a trail of fresh red cherries, red plums, cassis and blueberry fruit in a breathtakingly fresh, exhilarating style. Hints of licorice to close. This is phenomenal. A single-vineyard wine and the blend is vineyard-derived and shifts with the season.”

Quintet (the five Bordeaux varieties) is the king of the portfolio, the wine that was closest to founder Dr. John Middleton’s irascible heart. The vintage may have been especially great for pinot, but the rainbow of cassis, redcurrant, dried herb and bramble flavors are absolutely exemplary.”
