96 pts “Bright crimson-purple; a superbly crafted wine with infinite attention to detail. Red and black cherry, with a faint touch of raspberry, balanced by a hint of bramble, make the task of deconstructing the palate nigh on impossible, simply because there will be so many different readings of its message – but with one exception: its undeniable quality.”

This veers more towards the full-bodied end of the spectrum but has a textural softness that makes it drinkable now.”

It’s light, even for a Yarra Valley shiraz, focused on freshness—one taster described it as ‘frozen tart berries.’ The tannins are rocky and firm, though the wine feels gentle, a delicate study in contrasts.”
