VINTAGE: A fantastic spring with a highly successful flowering which allowed shoot thinning and cluster selection down to one bunch per shoot. The whole ripening season was a little earlier than average and despite some good January rain, the overall growing season was relatively dry. Fruit was picked with lower sugars but with beautiful flavor and stem ripeness. The resulting wines have lower alcohol, but similar acid levels to the 2017 and with a little more tannin structure.

WINEMAKING: Some of the grapes were crushed with 40% kept as whole clusters. Fermentation took place using indigenous yeasts in 4000L open top oak vats and stainless steel fermenters. Delestage was by gravity with some light hand plunges and pigeage. The wine was matured in 4,000L French oak vats and French oak barrels, 10% of which were new. The wine was not filtered prior to bottling by gravity.

TASTING NOTES: All the 2018 Giant Steps Pinots have lovely perfume, color and very generous mouthfeels. This wine expresses an intricate blend of delicious parcels from Giant Steps' Tarraford, Applejack, Lusatia Park, Primavera and Sexton vineyards. Powerful, lifted aromas of cherries, blue and red fruits are complemented by underlying savory, gamey characters.
