REGION: Yarra Valley, Victoria

VARIETALS: Pinot Noir

MATURATION: 10 months in French oak (18% new) ANALYSIS: 13.5% alc/vol | TA: 5.85 | pH: 3.66

VINEYARD: Wombat Creek Vineyard is the highest altitude vineyard in the Yarra Valley, making it an ideal location for the production of extreme cool climate wines. The underlying ferrous (red) based volcanic soil and rock produce a distinctively soft yet long and firm palate that contrasts with the finer palates seen from the nearby Applejack Vineyard (basalt based volcanic).

WINEMAKING: Hand-picked without additions. Picked in 2 parcels, in both cases 20% was destemmed to the base of the vat to commence a "pied de cuve" ferment. The vats were then filled to the brim with whole bunches and closed up to allow a semi carbonic maceration to occur. Occasional foot stomps were done to release a little more juice into the ferment and extend the time on skins. Pressed after 2 weeks to new and used tight grain French barriques

TASTING NOTES: All the 2018 Giant Steps Pinots have lovely perfume, color and very generous mouthfeels. The Wombat Creek offers creamy notes of wild strawberry, fresh flowers and red licorice with savory herb nuances. The palate is incredibly textural with great depth and intensity of flavor.
