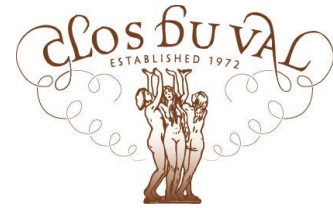


# 2015 CLOS DU VAL HIRONDELLE ESTATE CABERNET SAUVIGNON

## Review Summary



**93–96 pts** “The 2015 Cabernet Sauvignon Hironnelle Estate Vineyard hits the palate with serious intensity, power and depth. Once again, the Hironnelle is seamless and sumptuous in style, but like the best 2015s, it also retains superb freshness throughout. Crème de cassis, mint, graphite, lavender and cloves meld into the richly textured finish. There is so much potential here.”

**91–94** “The 2015 Cabernet Sauvignon Hironnelle Vineyard is a selection from some of the best blocks on the ranch, notably those towards the back of the property. Dark and voluptuous, with tons of Stags Leap character, the 2015 is loaded with inky blue/purplish fruit, mocha, dried herbs lavender, licorice and violet overtones. Perhaps even more importantly, the 2015 has preserved quite a bit of freshness and detail for such a big wine. Dense and plush on the palate, with silky tannins and tons of persistence, the 2015 is shaping up to be a beauty.”

**90–93 pts** “The 2015 Cabernet Sauvignon Hironnelle Estate is probably one of the best wines to emerge from this property in the last 40 years. **Outstanding** “Inky purple; aromas of molasses, myrtle and black plum. Very ripe, and somewhat opulent, this has classic Stags Leap suppleness, along with excellent depth of fruit, silky tannins and good acidity. While I prefer the traditional style of Clos du Val that was the trademark of this producer for more than 40 years, this is a beautifully made, appealing wine with an excellent sense of local terroir and with the stuffing to age for 15 plus years, perhaps peaking in 20 years. 100% new oak, but there is enough fruit to support the wood. As big a wine as this is, it is quite harmonious.”
