94 pts “An outstanding example of the restraint this style of wine often displays as a young wine, knowing that the future will tell a different story; hints of honeysuckle and straw, with a fleshy mid-palate are the key today, but in time added texture, toasty complexity and a mealy richness come after thoughtful cellaring.”

94 pts “Apple, lemon rind and apricot aromas, filter through a medium to full-bodied palate, balanced by minerality. Long and juicy. Supple wine that apparently has a good track record for aging.”

Suave, focused, pure citrus and orchard fruit flavors are given spine by tangy minerality and pick up a dusty mineral quality on the back half. I like this wine's Old World restraint and light touch; the finish is dry, nervy and very persistent.”
