**95 pts** “Not, as one might imagine, a regional blend from many sources, but from young vines on the Graveyard Vineyard and declassified wines from the original plantings. Vivid crimson, it is a seriously good shiraz, with dark red fruits enriched with a sauce of French oak and peppered with the firm tannins that will protect its longevity: a bare minimum of 30 years.”

**94 pts** “Dried spicy, brambly fruited, some wet concrete. Just gets better and better as it sits in the glass and the fruit gets darker. There’s a lush burst of black fruit running through the middle on the palate, and dusty, perfectly shape tannins around it. Masses of deep flavors and will evolve well in the medium term. Tastes complete.”
