95 pts “This is as typical of the Lower Yarra Valley as Lusatia Park is of the Upper Yarra. But it has a particular flavor and texture on the back-palate and finish, with a faint honeysuckle/cashew note; on retasting (several times) grapefruit also struck a blow.”

92 pts “This supple, succulent chardonnay grows at Phil Sexton’s north-facing vineyard on the slope neighboring Yarra Yering, just up the road from Coldstream Hills. The soil is shallow gravels and loam over rocky clay, and the vines benefit from all those rocks, producing fruit that lends this wine its tense acidity and freshness. The rich lemon flavors, sweet caramel and smoky notes of toasted lees are all wrapped up in that freshness, a ready complement to gingery grilled salmon.”
