VINTAGE: A fantastic spring with a highly successful flowering which allowed shoot thinning and cluster selection down to one bunch per shoot. The whole ripening season was a little earlier than average and despite some good January rain, the overall growing season was relatively dry. Fruit was picked with lower sugars but with beautiful fl avor and stem ripeness. The resulting wines have lower alcohol, but similar acid levels to the 2017 and with a little more tannin structure.

WINEMAKING: This wine is made from the unique 'Red Dog' clone of Syrah. The origin is unknown, and it displays an intense white pepper, even in the warmer years. The final blend was 55% whole cluster fermented in 4000L oak vats before being pressed into 500L French oak puncheons for malolactic fermentation and maturation on the lees. The wine was not fined or filtered and was gravity racked for bottling.

TASTING NOTES: This is a stellar example of cool climate Australian Syrah. Fresh aromas of violets and peppercorns overlay black and blue berries. The palate is full-bodied but silky. It clings with excellent tenacity and focus, leaving black raspberry and floral pastille notes behind.
