Review Summary



94 pts “This translucent dark red colored Pinot Noir from Chapter 24 opens with a black raspberry and black cherry with hints of blackberry. On the palate, this wine is medium bodied, pleasantly acidic and smooth. The flavor profile is a spicy red plum and oak blend with notes of graphite, anise and black cherry. I also detected hints of blueberry. The finish is dry and its flavors linger and last for quite some.”

Finishes impressively long and silky, with well-knit tannins and emphatic, floral-driven persistence.”
