

## 2016 JOHN DUVAL WINES ANNEXUS GRENACHE

### Review Summary



**97 pts** “From two very old low-yielding Barossa vineyards, one in the Northern Barossa, one in the Eden Valley over 150yo. The marriage of ancient vines and modern skills in the winery has produced a remarkable grenache at the forefront of the revitalization of the style. It is powerful and intense, yet the flavors are in the fresh red spectrum with a savory crosscurrent of fine, dusty tannins. There is no confection, no Turkish delight anywhere to be seen.”

**93 pts** “Delicate streaks of Mediterranean herbs and dried spices add nuance to the cherry fruit in Duval’s 2016 Annexus Grenache. Aged a year in older hogsheads, the oak impact is minimal. It’s a medium to full-bodied, suave expression of old-vine Barossa Grenache, with a slightly coarse, tannic feel that adds a savory edge to fruit that might otherwise be too confectioned.”
