

2019 GREYWACKE WILD SAUVIGNON

94 pts “As its name suggests, the 2019 Sauvignon Blanc Wild relies on only natural yeasts to turn the grape juice into wine in old oak barrels. Providing excellent concentration, balance and textural finesse, this is a finely woven style. There’s less funk and reduction compared with previous vintages, which Judd says is fairly random. This is an elegant expression; the tangy flint notes of reduction and floral, white talc flavors of wild ferment are part of the wine but not front and center. Instead, they provide layers that combine with the citrus and herb flavors. The finish is long, fine and subtle. I think this is one of the most refined and integrated Wild Sauvignons I’ve had the pleasure to taste.”
