WINEMAKER:

REGION: VARIETALS: Chester Osborn

McLaren Vale and Adelaide Hills, South Australia Cabernet Sauvignon (78%), Merlot (12%), Petit Verdot

(8%) Cabernet Franc (2%)

MATURATION: 18 months in predominantly 1 & 2 year old French oak

ANALYSIS: 14.5% alc/vol | TA: 7.3 g/L | pH: 3.41

BACKGROUND: 'Garagiste' refers to producers in Bordeaux that make wine in their garage outside of the strict 'Appellation Controlee' system. d'Arenberg wines are all made in a small - batch process, very hands on (or feet, as the reds are all foot - trod) as the 'garagistes' do. The reds are made in the old galvanised shed/winery, hence 'Galvo'.

WINEMAKING NOTES: Small batches of grapes are gently crushed and then transferred to five ton headed down open fermenters. These batches remain separate until final blending. Foot treading is undertaken two thirds of the way through fermentation. The wine is then basket pressed and transferred to a mixture of seasoned French barriques to complete fermentation. The barrel ferments are aged on lees, and there is no racking until final blending. This wine does not undertake fining or filtration prior to bottling.

TASTING NOTES: What a nose - lots of herbs and very leafy. Capsicum accompanies the mouth, some maraschino cherries and savory spices. White and black pepper make themselves known towards the back palate. Still quite dry from the Cabernet. A beautiful roundness from the Merlot. The Petit Verdot and Cabernet Franc add an element of finesse, as well as a lifted vibrancy. The wine is quite fresh at this early stage.
