95 pts "Very polished, with vanilla bean and mocha aromas to the velvety core of rich black cherry and blackberry flavors. Despite the boldness, this wine shows plenty of restraint, with details filling in the gaps to give this a seamless expression, revealing grace notes of Thai iced tea and wild thyme."

94 pts "Emily McNally makes this wine from a vineyard in Mia Mia, south of Heathcote, where the cool summer and warm, dry harvest season provided a bright, sunny shiraz with earthy fruit in the service of its granitic soils. The tannins are black and mineral rich, opening to yield a range of spice, from black pepper to cinnamon and clove, while the fruit seems to keep them gentle. Like all Jasper Hill wines, this is made with minimal intervention and farmed organically."

Initial aromas of raisiny plum and vanilla morph into something more complex, showing wild sage, thyme, black pepper, pencil lead and a little meatiness. The palate is concentrated and fruity, but those same herbal characters are apparent here, too, backed by structured, savory tannins and lifted acidity. Drink now-2028."
